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# Notice of person's wish to be party to proceeding

- 1 Wellington City Council wishes to be a party to the following proceeding:
  - (a) The Appellants' appeal against parts of the Respondent's decision on the Proposed Natural Resources Plan (**Proposed Plan**) (ENV-2019-WLG-000118).
- 2 Wellington City Council is a local authority and has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest that the general public has because parts of the appeal relate to the Glasgow Wharf which is located in an area in which the Council has a substantial interest.
- 3 Wellington City Council is not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C of the RMA.
- 4 Wellington City Council is interested in the parts of the appeal that relate to the Glasgow Wharf (paragraphs 24-26, 49—54 and 61-64).
- 5 Wellington City Council is interested in the inclusion of Glasgow Wharf in Schedule E2 of the Proposed Plan and the implications the scheduling will have on the Wharf and surrounding area.
- 6 Wellington City Council supports the relief sought by the Appellants because the scheduling of Glasgow Wharf:
  - (a) will restrict the future efficient and safe operation of the area;
  - (b) will mean that the Proposed Plan fails to provide for the appropriate use, maintenance, development and upgrade of regionally significant infrastructure;
  - (c) is not the most efficient or effective way of achieving any objective of the Proposed Plan as required by s 32 of the RMA; and
  - (d) will not promote sustainable management or enable social, economic and cultural wellbeing and is inconsistent with Part 2 of the RMA.

- 7 Wellington City Council agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceeding.
