- 1 Wellington City Council wishes to be a party to the following proceeding:
 - (a) The Appellants' appeal against parts of the Respondent's decision on the Proposed Natural Resources Plan (**Proposed Plan**) (ENV-2019-WLG-000118).
- Wellington City Council is a local authority and has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest that the general public has because parts of the appeal relate to the Glasgow Wharf which is located in an area in which the Council has a substantial interest.
- Wellington City Council is not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C of the RMA.

 - (d) will not promote sustainable management or enable social, economic and cultural wellbeing and is inconsistent with Part 2 of the RMA.

Wellington City Council agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceeding.
