Access Planning Manager's Report - Work in Progress

1. Purpose

To update the Committee about the work of the Access Planning team.

2. Significance of the Decision

The matters in this report do not trigger the significance policy of the Council or otherwise trigger section 76(3)(b) of the Local Government Act 2002.

3. Comment

3.1 Regional Land Transport Strategy Review

3.1.1 Vision, objectives and policies

Drafts of these were agreed by the Committee at its meeting on 14 December 2004.

3.1.2 Western Corridor Review

The review is continuing in accordance with an agreed programme. A meeting of the Committee will be held on 7 July to approve a preferred package for consultation.

3.1.3 CBD Corridor Study

The first stage of technical work is nearing completion. We are aiming to have a draft corridor plan developed in July to go to Wellington City Council and the RLTC in August.

3.1.4 Wellington Regional Strategy Coordination

Every possible effort is being made to coordinate the consideration of strategic transport options with the Wellington Region Strategy process which is planning on a public consultation process around high level outcomes in mid 2005. The RLTS review process will then develop a draft RLTS for public consultation in late 2005.

3.1.5 Demand Management Strategy

A draft demand management strategy has been developed and is the subject of a separate report to the Committee.

3.2 Regional road safety week

A campaign targeting intersection safety was run between 20 March and 9 April. The “Give way OK!” campaign was a collaborative effort between Greater Wellington, the regions’ Road safety coordinators and LTNZ’s safety representatives. Feedback about the campaign has been positive.
